Immunization Requirements for 2009-2010

We have received new updates from KDHE for Kansas immunization requirements for the 2009-2010 school year. Preschool children less than 5 years of age must have several immunizations we have not looked at in the past. These are in addition to those required in the past.

Children who will be in Kindergarten (in the fall, 2009) must have two varicella (chickenpox) doses unless they have had the disease. According to KDHE, a licensed physician must document if a child had the disease.

Students in grades 1-9 must have at least one dose of Varicella (unless they had the disease) and three hepatitis B shots.

In addition, students who are now 10 years of age or will be 11 years old during the 2009-2010 school year are required to have a Tdap booster.

All students will be required to have 3 doses of Hepatitis B and 2 doses of varicella for the 2010-2011 school year.

We encourage all parents to have their children immunized before August, 2009. You may go to your health care professional or your local health department.

Attention Parents!!

Each year in May we have a health care professional come to WBE/UHS to conduct physical exams. Students must have a physical exam on file before they may begin practicing either athletics or spirit groups.

This year the community Health Center of Southeast Kansas will be conducting physicals for \$10 on Wednesday, May 13, at UHS. Interested students may also receive a free tetanus booster shot and a free meningococcal shot at the same time. If students are covered by Health Wave insurance, Medicaid insurance or First Guard insurance and have a copy of their card, the exam is free.

The \$10 fee must be paid the day of the exam if students do not have the above insurance. Letters with additional information will be sent to parents later in April.

Kindergarten Roundup is April 16-17

A screening clinic for 2009-2010 kindergarten students has been scheduled for Thursday, April 16, and Friday, April 17, at West Bourbon Elementary. To be eligible for kindergarten your child must be five years old on or before August 31, 2009.

Please phone the school to set up a time to bring your child for the assessment and screening. The phone number is 620-756-4335.

A nurse from the Community Health Center of Southeast Kansas will be at WBE between 8:30 and 1:30 on Thursday, April 16, to conduct free preschool physicals and free immunizations for interested

preschool and pre-kindergarten children. Please let us know if you are interested in these services when you call to schedule a time for your child's screening.

Children will not be allowed to begin classes until we are provided with a copy of their physical assessment and current immunizations. In addition to basic immunizations, kindergarten children must have the hepatitis B shots and two varicella shots.

For the screening and assessment, along with the immunization record and current physical, you must also bring your child's birth certificate and social security card.

Preschool Screening Clinic

Developmental screenings will be available for preschool aged children at West Bourbon Elementary on Friday afternoon, April 17. The purpose of the screening clinic is to locate children with possible developmental delays who may need special education preschool and related services or who need assistance with referrals to other service agencies.

Vision, hearing, speech and developmental screening will be

conducted for children birth through age four at no cost. A telephone interview will be conducted as a part of the prescreening appointment process.

Appointments for children birth through age two can be made by calling Beth Case at the Birth to Three Program, phone number 620-249-2949. Appointments for children ages three through five years may be made by calling Debbie Potter at 620-235-3152.

Please note that this is not a screening for the four-year-old At-Risk program.
